FACT SHEET

Mustique lies 18 miles south of the island of St. Vincent and forms part of St. Vincent & The Grenadines, a collection of exquisitely unspoiled islands dotted across the Eastern Caribbean. Mustique itself encompasses only 1,400 acres, measuring 1.5 miles wide by 3 miles long of rolling hills and surprisingly lush terrain with stretches of deserted white sand beaches surrounded by protected reefs and clear aquamarine seas. Mustique is privately owned by The Mustique Company, which comprises the island's property owners, with representation from 17 countries.

Mustique is a picturesque, idyllic island reminiscent of a simpler time. There is only one hotel (Cotton House), one guest house (Firefly), Basil's Bar, Corea's Food Store, several boutiques, Sweetie Pie Bakery, a bamboo Church and none of the world's modern disturbances – no congestion, traffic lights, power lines, beach vendors or litter.

Air Transportation: Daily non-stop service from New York to Barbados (4 1/2 hours), Miami to Barbados (3-1/2 hours) on American Airlines, JetBlue, Air Caribbean and Air Jamaica. US Airways has direct service from Philadelphia. Delta flies

from Atlanta into Barbados. Air Canada flies from Toronto to Barbados.

The Mustique Company arranges for daily scheduled connections between Barbados and Mustique on Grenadine Airways. The airline also offers private charters on twin-engine aircraft to all Caribbean islands. The Mustique Shuttle provides a scheduled service to and from St. Vincent. There is a maximum luggage allowance of 44 pounds per person on Grenadine Airways.

Private aircraft can fly into nearby Canouan or St. Lucia and we can arrange for air charters.

Mooring:

Mustique's harbor and jetty is sheltered from the trade winds. Mooring buoys are provided for vessels with draughts up to 15 feet. Mooring charges (for 1 to 3 nights) in Britannia Bay are:

Population:

1,400 employees of The Mustique Company with an increase of 500 guests during peak winter season.

Government:

The Government of St. Vincent & The Grenadines passed into law The Mustique Company Limited Act 1989, which appointed The Mustique Company as custodian of the island.

Language:

English. However because there are 17 countries represented in ownership on the island and Europe is a primary market, German, Italian, French, Spanish and Dutch are also commonly spoken.

Currency:

Eastern Caribbean dollar and U.S. dollar
Exchange Rate -- \$2.68 E.C. = \$1 U.S.
The company can accept travelers checks and some foreign currencies, including US dollars.

Accommodations:

74 privately owned luxury residences are currently available for weekly rental, ranging from two to nine-bedrooms, each with its own distinctive style of architecture, interior design, swimming pools, landscaped gardens, etc.

The remaining plots of freehold title land available for new owners are situated to the south and will be sold over a six-to-ten year period. Each residential site is spaciouly separated by greenery; pasture land or virgin forest affording maximum privacy.

The Cotton House – The 17-room hotel, the only one on the island, is owned by The Mustique Company. It is scenically located on 13-acres of palms and greens between Endeavour Bay on the Caribbean and L'Ansecoy Bay on the Atlantic. Originally built by Colin Tennant around an old coral barn used for storing cotton, the hotel is managed by GLA Hotels and is a member of Leading Small Hotels of The World. Firefly – Intimate guest house overlooking Britannia Bay features five bedrooms, a restaurant and bar.

Tariff:

Mustique has two rate seasons for villa rentals; May 1 through December 14 and December 15 through April 30. Weekly rates range from \$5,000 to \$50,000.

All villas include a minimum of three dedicated staff and use of a mule/golf cart. Larger villas have butlers and/house managers. They cook and serve meals, daily housekeeping, iron, laundry, tend to the gardens, pool, etc. Babysitting services can be arranged in advance thru Human Resources Dept. for a fee. Overnights can also be scheduled.

**Bars/Restaurants:
Cocktail Reception**

A complimentary weekly Tuesday evening party is hosted by The Mustique Company for island guests and villa owners in the Great Room at the Cotton House.

The Cotton House – Lunch or cocktails at the Beach Café overlooking Endeavour Bay. Afternoon tea is served on The Veranda. Breakfast and candlelight dinners served in The Veranda or thru room service. Light fare and drinks are served at the new Tree Garden Lounge. Outdoor movies are on Friday and Saturday evenings.

Basil's Bar & Restaurant – A popular gathering place (open 365 days a year), offering the perfect setting for island guests and villa owners to enjoy casual drinks and good food. Sitting on stilts at the water's edge, it's an ideal place to enjoy sunset cocktails. Weekly Wednesday night "Jump Up & Barbecue" with live music. (784) 488-8350.

Firefly – Restaurant and cocktail bar with bay views.

Picnic tables at Macaroni Beach must be reserved in advance through Activities Director's office. Villa staff prepare and serve lunches to their guests.

Dress Code:

Casual, yet sophisticated attire. Ladies normally wear dresses in the evening. No jacket and tie required anywhere on the island. *Barefoot elegance.*

Activities:

Walking, hiking and horse riding trails cover much of Mustique and a Fitness Trail (about 2 miles). The Equestrian Center and Water Sports Center provide instruction on riding, SCUBA diving (special "bubble maker" instruction course for children), sailing and windsurfing.

Complimentary use of tennis courts and lessons are available with the Resident Pro. Richard Schaffer.

Spa treatments available at the Cotton House Spa or in your villa.

Mustique's lagoon is the perfect setting for bird watching. ("see Island Activities" Fact Sheet.)

Off Island Activities:

Our Activities Director can organize day trips to St. Vincent with tours to the capital, Kingstown, La Soufriere volcano and Salt Pond at Owia. Fishing trips and day sails to the Grenadine Islands of Bequia, Canouan, Tobago Cays, Palm and Petit St. Vincent can be arranged or golf on Canouan.

Entertainment:

Information on "What's Happening" on Mustique is provided by The Mustique Company. Assistance with special catered functions is available through the Activities Director's department.

Vehicle Rental:

Mules can be rented from the Mustique Mechanical Services. Drivers must be at least 17 years of age and hold a valid international driver's license to obtain local driver's permit. This license can be purchased at the airport. There is an island-wide speed limit of 20 miles per hour. **One complimentary vehicle is included in the villa rental.**

Electricity:

220 volts, 50 cycles

Medical Services:

The Resident Doctor, Dr. Michael Bunbury, operates a fully equipped modern clinic and dispensary offering full medical and emergency care, including the arrangement of emergency evacuation.

Conservation Area:

Mustique, its beaches, shores and surrounding waters for 1,000 yards is a Conservation Area. The flora and fauna and wildlife are all protected. Jet skis and spear guns are not permitted.

Environmental Committee:

The island has an Environmental Committee and writes a quarterly newsletter (on our website).

Britannia Bay:

Britannia Bay is a focal point of the island with its strategic position. A few shops, the fishermen's village, Basil's are situated along the harbor.

Basil's Boutique – t-shirt shop sells beachwear, hand-printed and imported clothing.

Across Forever – offers Balinese furniture, furnishings, accessories along with original gifts.

Sweetie Pie Bakery – tempting freshly baked breads, croissants, cakes, brioche. Open six days a week. International newspapers.

Fish Market – for the freshest daily catches. Open Monday – Friday (8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.); Saturday (8:00 a.m. – 12 noon).

Corea's Food Store – is the island's supermarket but also sells wines and liquors. A master account is established for all villa guests prior to arrival.

Basil's Gourmet Shop –the store stocks all the best things in life from champagnes, caviar and French cheeses to other delicacies. Groceries, fresh produce, liquors and toiletries are also available.

Pink House – chic women's designer clothing, resort wear by Lotty B's own label, jewelry, sandals, attractive children's and menswear, candles, etc.

Purple House – stylish swimwear, beach toys, sun items, souvenirs, straw hats, lotions, etc.

International Newspapers:

Island guests have the luxury of ordering daily international newspapers from 50 countries, printed in 30 languages. Newspapers available the same day between 7 and 9 AM each morning for a \$4 charge.

Library:

The Mustique Community Library with 4,000 books has four computers with high speed Internet access. A large inventory of DVDs are also available for rental.

Internet Access:

All villas have high-speed Internet connections free of charge and most have Wi-Fi and iPod docking stations.

Church Services:

At the Mustique Christian Assembly.

Spa:

The Cotton House Spa on Endeavour Bay has a Fitness Center, four treatment rooms, a relaxation area with sea views and a beauty salon. The Spa encompasses a selection of treatments using E'SPA's "Energy, Harmony and Balance" products. Villa guests can also enjoy treatments in the privacy of their villas. The Mustique Blues Festival is held annually in January/ February and is produced by Basil Charles and Dana Gillespie.
