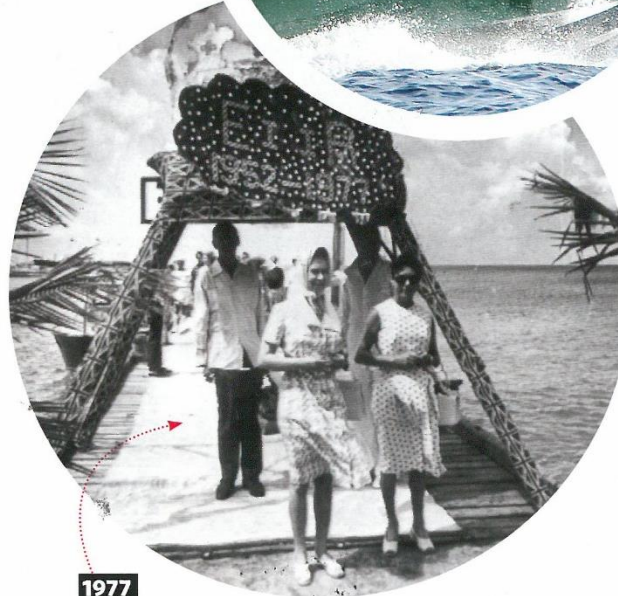

TURKISH DELIGHT

Traditionally, spas in Turkey offer a rough rub-and-scrub approach to bathing. But the new spa at Soho House Istanbul has turned tradition on its head to offer an experience for sybarites in a cavernous space carved into a

hillside on the banks of the Bosphorus. Treatments use products from British brand Cowshed in everything from facials to foot rubs. The on-site hammam room is clad in beautiful Moorish green tiles and an authentic

no-nonsense approach. Follow up with a swim in the rooftop pool (right) or indulge in a cocktail or two at Ceconi's, another noteworthy string to the bow of the newly opened hotel.

ON THE RADAR MARRAKECH

The red city's luxury hotel boom seemingly knows no bounds, as five-star brands jostle to offer increasingly indulgent accommodation in the city.

First up this season is the Mandarin Oriental Marrakech, a 63-villa site on 20 hectares of rose- and bougainvillea-filled gardens near the Golf Club (but a little way out of town).

On the other side of the golf course, the Park Hyatt is taking shape on a private gated complex.

Joining them in September is The Grace, with 18 suites in Berber-style buildings and its own stable of horses on a quiet and peaceful edge-of-the-city desert site.
